WORKING DAYS

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- Any students who is persistently insubordinate, who is willfully mischievous and who is likely to have an unwholesome influence on fellow students, may be removed from the rolls or served with compulsory T.C.
- The educational concession extended and the scholarships awarded are liable to be re-funded.
- Students are free to meet the Principal on any matter of discipline. curricular and co-curricular activities etc. On any matter of discipline, the decision of the Principal will be final.
- Smoking, use of drugs and mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the Campus. Use of intoxicants like liquor, pan masala etc. is strictly banned. Offenders have to face strict disciplinary action. Any complaint of misbehaviour will be seriously dealt with. Resorting to Vulgar words and comments to opposite sex will invite serious action.
- Political activism is strictly banned in the campus. Students are forbidden to organise or attend meetings other than the official ones.

ETHICS

- Timeliness** : Students must follow the calendar of working days and the time schedule of the college.
- Sincerity** : Attend every class with attitude and aptitude.
- Cleanliness** : Cleanliness is next to Godliness. Keep the campus clean. Don't throw any waste in the campus. Use dustbins for the purpose.
- Discipline** : After the first bell in the morning, every student must be in the classroom. Observe silence during prayer. Keep silence in the library. Learn to give respect and take respect.
- Modesty** : Maintain modesty in dress.

Utilise library during lunch break and free hours. Actively participate in the extra-curricular activities like NSS, NCC. Clubs Associations. etc. Encourage parents to visit the college periodically. Park bicycles. Motor bikes etc. in the area provided. Pay attention to the notifications appearing on the notice boards.

ATTENDANCE

- Regular attendance is compulsory. Students have to get prior permission for leave with leave form duly countersigned by the guardian or parent.
- Teachers mark the attendance at the beginning of each period. If a student is absent for one period in a session, it will be treated as half day's absence.

MANNERS AND CONDUCT

"Once students are admitted to an educational institution they are bound by the code of conduct laid down by educational institutions through the prospectus or college calendar and it is implicit that they should observe the code of conduct necessary for the administration and management of the institution". (Judgement of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala, Vide No. 535/2003 dt. 26 May 2003) Life in the campus must be inspired by unity, mutual trust and co-operation among the Students, Faculty and Management. Every student must make it a point of his/her personal duty to attend classes regularly and punctually. For the fine tuning of the daily routine, students are expected to be in the class before the first bell and participate in the silent prayer. They shall obey the following guidelines to safe guard the reputation of the institution.

IDENTITY CARD

An Identity card will be issued to the student at the time of admission. It is the responsibility of the student to see that the card is duly attested by the principal. The student should carry this card while he/she is in the campus and should produce the same on demand by any teaching staff. If the card is lost, a duplicate can be obtained on payment of Rs. 50/-

General Discipline

1. All students are responsible to the Principal for their conduct both inside and outside the college. They must respect others, especially teachers and greet them whenever they meet.
2. Students shall not enter or leave the class without the permission of the teacher who engages the class. They shall not enter other classes without permission.
3. Students shall not disfigure the walls and furniture by writing, engraving, stamping or pasting. They should handle the college property with utmost care.
4. Students are not to organise or attend any meeting in the campus, or collect money for any purpose and should not circulate or paste any notice or petition anywhere in the campus without the permission of the Principal.

FEE STRUCTURE

As per G.O.M.S. No. 9574/H.Edn. dated 12.06.1974 tuition fee will be collected in eight equal monthly installments. Special fees, caution deposit etc shall be paid in lumpsum at the time of admission together with the first installment of tuition fee. Tuition fee is payable on the due dates prescribed. If any student fails to pay fees on the due date he/she shall be liable to pay the fees along with a fine of Rs. 5- on or before the due date. If the fee with the fine is not paid on or before the 10th day after the 7th consecutive working day of the month, an additional fine of Rs. 5/- will have to be paid. Defaulter will be removed from the rolls.

Students from other Universities/Boards shall pay additional fees Rs.350/- (Matriculation-Rs.50/-, Recognition -Rs. 200/-, Eligibility -Rs. 100/-)

Project Evaluation

Dissertation/Project to be submitted at the end of the last semester will be valued by a Board of 2 examiners appointed by the university. The maximum marks shall be 100 of which 25% shall be allotted for viva-voce examination which shall be conducted along with the comprehensive viva.

End Semester Assessment

End semester assessment of all the semesters shall be conducted by the university. There shall be double valuation system of answer books. The average of 2 valuations shall be taken into account. if there is a variations of more than 15% the answer books shall be valued by a third examiner.

Pass Requirement

Those who secure not less than 30% marks for ESA for each paper and an aggregate minimum of 40% marks including CA for all the papers of a semester shall be declared to have successfully completed the semester. However, practical and theory can be treated as separate units. The marks for project and viva will be carried over. Those who have successfully completed all the semesters of a Programme shall be declared to have successfully completed the PG Programme.

Classification of Results

The classification of the results of the programme shall be done at the end of the fourth semester based on the total marks secured for all semesters and shall be as follows:

- Candidate securing not less than 40% but below 50% - Third Class
 Candidate securing not less than 50% but below 60% - Second Class
 Candidate securing 60% and above - First Class



The Marks of the Courses taken over and above the minimum prescribed For the successful completion of a Programme and award of the Degree, a Credits, shall not be counted for the computing CCPA. student must pass all Courses satisfying the minimum Credit requirement and must score a minimum CCPA OF 4.00 or an overall grade of E.

Regulations of C.S.S.P.G. Programme

Regulations Relating to the PG Programmes

The normal duration of a Degree Programme shall be four semester. No student shall be permitted to complete the programme by attending more than 8 continuous semesters. The duration of each semester shall be five months inclusive of examinations. There shall be at least 90 instructional days in a semester and a minimum of 450 hours of instructions in a semester.

Evaluation of each paper shall be done in two parts (1) Continuous Assessment (CA) and (2) End Semester assessment (ESA). The distribution of marks shall be 25% for CA and 75% for ESA. The allocation of marks for each component under continuous assessment shall be in the following proportions.

The marks of a Course are consolidated by combining the marks of ESE and CE (80+20)

Consolidation of SCPA: SCPA is obtained by dividing the sum of Credit Points (CP) obtained in a semester by the sum of Credits (c) taken in that semester. After the successful completion of a semester, Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA) of a student in that semester shall be calculated. Suppose the student has taken four Courses each of 4 Credits and two Courses each of 2 Credits in a particular semester, after consolidating the Grade for each Course. SCPA has to be calculated as shown in the example given below:

A.P.JABDUL KALAM LIBRARY

As a fully automated modern library it can be redefined and remolded the user community in accordance with changing needs and discovery. delivery of information with help of adapting new technologies. The library building has reading room and stack room about 9000 sq.feet. separately. The library is fully automated using LIBSOFT software with more than 27000 volume text books and reference books. Total 20 periodicals magazines and 10 newspapers are subscribed in the library. Digital collection includes DVDS, CD-ROMS, online public access catalogue (OPAC), WEB OPAC (iqbal.libsoft.org) enables to search for check the status of books in the library. Fully networked 5 computers with high speed internet facility. E. journals can be accessed from the Digital library and remote access through N-LIST programme of INFLIBNET. E-resources can be accessed through the library website iqbalcollegelibrary.wordpress.com. for the enhancement of reading, library has instituted annual best user award for students. Library maintains a career reference section as a separate wing in the main library to enhance the career potential for students. Career related information journals, reference books, question banks of various competitive examinations are provided for reference in the library. Students can access the library between 9.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on all working days.

Rules

- Silence should be strictly observed in the library
- Students are required to produce their identity card and record their names in the gate register.
- Periodicals and books in the reference section will not be lend out. It can be referred inside the library, by submitting the dairy.
- If a book is damaged or lost by a member he/she will have to replace it with fine
- Defaulter shall pay three times of the cost of the book
- A member who fails to return a book on due date will be fined Rs. 1/ day until the book is returned.



- Before applying for any certificate from the college, members have to get a clearance certificate from the library.
- In all matters regarding the library, the decision of the principal shall be final.

Physical Education

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE FIRST DEGREE PROGRAMMES**

The university of Kerala Regulations relating to the First Degree programmes under the Choice Based Credit and Semester (CBCS) system in Affiliated Colleges.

The duration of undergraduate programmes under CBCSS, is 3 years, which consists of 6 semesters. Each semester consists of 450 contact hours distributed over 90 working days within 18 five day academic weeks. The structure of the courses is as follows:

EXAMINATIONS

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts:

1) Continuous Evaluation (CE) 2) End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The CE and ESE ratio shall be 1:4 for both Courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE. For all Courses (Theory and Practical), Grades are given on a 7- point scale based on the total percentage of mark (CE + ESE) as given below.

Attendance

Student who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the papers of a semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for the end semester assessment of the semester.

Assignments or Seminars: (Max. marks 10)

Each student shall be required to do one assignment or one seminar for each Course. Valued assignments shall be returned to the students. The seminars shall be organized by the teacher /teachers in charge of CE and the same shall be assessed by a group of teachers including the teacher/ teachers in charge of that Course. Assignments/ Seminars shall be given for punctuality in submission. Seminar shall be similarly evaluated in terms of structure, content, presentation, interaction etc.

Tests: (Max. marks 10)

For each Course there shall be one class test during a semester. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal within 10 working days from the date of the test.

End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

End Semester Evaluation of all the Courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE shall be arranged to be published according to the Examination Calendar prescribed by the University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC), Which shall not exceed 45 days from the last day of the examination.
